

**Materials List for:
Cut, Pierce, Sew and Suspend with Metal and Found Objects
(with Phoenix Forrester)**

Bring one or two pieces of metal of your choosing. 20 or 22 gauge sheet will work well for our base. If you wish to sew on another thinner piece, bring one or two small pieces of 24 or 26 gauge as well. Please get whatever is in your spending plan...sterling, red or yellow brass, or copper.

A main piece of sheet metal 4" x 2.5" is nice, but any size that suits you is fine! This will be something to wear! (If you like smaller things, bring a smaller piece of metal, or larger, if that is your style).

Bring several feet (5 or 6 feet) of wire, again sterling, brass or copper is fine. 20-gauge wire works well. It has the strength and resilience we need for "sewing" objects onto our metal.

Bring 3 drill bits that correspond to your 20-gauge wire. (They will help you at Indian Jewelry Supply to get the correct ones).

A little bundle (I think sold in packs of 10) of the most sturdy saw blades for a handsaw. The biggest teeth. If you have your own hand saw, bring that, or you may use mine.

And the fun stuff! Bring your antique hammered steel belt buckles and shoe clips, vintage Bakelite buckles, intricate sterling filigree pieces and any other rhinestone jewels and things that you love, that have an airy quality that we can sew, lace and dangle with wire, as we adhere it to your base piece of metal. You may also bring old photos and large pieces of mica to make your pieces really interesting!

A pair of metal cutting scissors or shears. (If you don't have these, I have one pair to share).

A pair of safety goggles.
